- Featuring celebrated critics and long-time coop members A.O. Scott and James Poniewozik.

A.O. Scott has been a film critic at the New York Times since 2000 and a member of the Park Slope Food Co-op since 1996, working mainly in childcare and food processing. He has also contributed essays and reviews to the New York Review of Books, Esquire, Food and Wine, and other publications. He is the author of *BETTER LIVING THROUGH CRITICISM: HOW TO THINK ABOUT ART, PLEASURE, BEAUTY, AND TRUTH*, which was published in 2016.

James Poniewozik has been the chief television critic of the New York Times since 2015. His reviews and essays focus on the intersection between the art of television and our changing society and politics. He wrote "Audience of One: Donald Trump, Television, and the Fracturing of America," published in 2019, which connects the rise of Trump as a public "character" with the fragmentation of the media since 1980. He was a TV and media critic for Time magazine and the media columnist for Salon. He misses his early morning maintenance squad and is taking suggestions for new work slots!
